Honours Requirements

- Total credits required for Honours subject = 42 senior-level credits (non-duplicative coursework)
 - Required courses = 21 credits as specified below
 - Specialization = 21 credits chosen from any senior-level Psychology courses
- Total credits required for Other Requirements = 42 credits as specified below
 - Required honours Psychology courses = 12 senior-level credits
 - Approved honours options = 12 senior-level credits
 - Minimum of 18 credits designated must be completed outside of the discipline, excluding any credits used to satisfy the core requirements).
- 9 credits must be completed at the 300-level**
- 9 credits must be completed at the 400-level except PSYC 439⁶**

Required Junior Level Courses

- PSYC 104
- PSYC 105 - Prerequisite is a minimum grade of C- in PSYC 104
- STAT 151 (or equivalent - STAT 141 & STAT 152)
