1. HIST and CLAS courses can be used to satisfy the Humanities breadth requirement of a Bachelor of Arts degree.
2. HIST and CLAS courses can be used to satisfy the Arts core requirement of a Bachelor of Science degree.
3. Students minoring in History are not required to take junior-level HIST or CLAS courses as part of their degree, though they are encouraged to do so. Students are required to research and meet the prerequisites for every senior-level HIST course they take as part of their degree.
4. Additional history credits can be placed in options. Bachelor of Arts students can take up to 60 credits in any one discipline.
