Students who have previously completed SOCI 210 will not be required to take SOCI 310, as SOCI 210 and 310 are equivalent. Please keep in mind that course offerings will vary from academic year to academic year. Students may address questions about planned course offerings to the Sociology discipline chair or the Faculty of Arts and Science Program Services Office.
