## **IMPORTANT PLANNING NOTES**

- 1. A student's 6CR of junior-level English 6CR out of 12CR toward the Language and Literacy core requirements of the Bachelor of Arts degree or the 6CR of English in the core requirements of the Bachelor of Science degree.
- 2. Equivalent courses may be used to meet this requirement, including previously offered ENGL 100 (6CR), 101 (6CR) and 105 (6CR).
- 3. See below for a list of English courses offered at MacEwan University. Course offerings will vary from academic year to academic year. Student may address questions about planned course offerings to the English discipline chair or the Faculty of Arts and Science Program Services Office.
- 4. Courses that have been renumbered from 200-level to 300-level will be counted toward a student's minor as the level they were numbered at the time when the student took the course.
- 5. These courses may fulfill either the 3CR of time-based requirements *or* the 6CR of geographically-based requirements, but students must take 9CR of non-duplicative course work to meet these requirements.
