IMPORTANT PLANNING NOTES

- 1. A student's 6CR in a Language other than English can be used to fulfill half of the 12CR Language and Literacy core requirements of the Bachelor of Arts degree. The Language other than English credits can also be used to meet the International Content exit requirement for the BA degree. Exit requirements are the only time a student can use a course as duplicate credit.
- 2. Junior-level HIST and CLAS courses can be used to satisfy the Humanities core requirement of a Bachelor of Arts degree.
- 3. Students majoring in History are not required to take junior-level HIST or CLAS courses as part of their degree, though they are encouraged to do so. Students are required to research and meet the prerequisites for every senior-level HIST course they take as part of their degree.
