IMPORTANT PLANNING NOTES

- PSYC 104 works toward the Science core requirement of the Bachelor of Arts degree. PSYC 105 works toward the Social Sciences
 core requirement of the BA degree. Both courses meet the Social Sciences core requirement in the Bachelor of Science degree;
 alternately, PSYC 105 may be used toward the Arts core requirement in the B.Sc. degree.
- 2. PSYC 241 and SOCI 241 are equivalent courses. Credit can be obtained in only one of the two courses. SOCI 241 can be used toward a Psychology minor.
- 3. See the reverse side of this sheet for a listing of Psychology courses offered at MacEwan University. Course offerings will vary from academic year to academic year. Student may address questions about planned course offerings to the Arts Psychology discipline chair or the Faculty of Arts and Science Program Services Office.
