1. SOCI 100 can be used toward the Social Sciences core requirement of the BA degree.
2. SOCI 241 and PSYC 241 are equivalent courses. Credit can be obtained in only one of the two courses. PSYC 241 can be used toward a Sociology major.
3. Students who have previously completed SOCI 210 will not be required to take SOCI 310. SOCI 310 may not be taken for credit if credit has been obtained in STAT 151 and students must fulfill the SOCI 310 requirement with another senior-level SOCI course.
