How to run an Academic Program Progress Report (APPR):

1. Log in to myStudentSystem
2. From the landing page, click the “Academic Progress” tile
3. From menu on left, choose “Print APPR”

*If you started your program (or declared your major) prior to 2019, are a block transfer student, or you feel your APPR does not accurately reflect your courses/progress, you can [request a program check](#) to have an Advisor review your program and requirements. To complete the request, you will be prompted to log in with your MacEwan information, so be sure you have logged out of any Google app or account.*

**DEGREE REGULATIONS**

- Students are advised to declare a major prior to completion of 60 credits; minors are optional (15 credits) and must fit into your required electives
- Minimum 120 credits of non-duplicative coursework
- Minimum of 60 credits completed at MacEwan University
- Maximum of 39 credits at the junior, 100-level
- Complete the number of required Business, Non-Business and Open electives as required by major.
- Overall Graduation Grade Point Average (GGPA) of 2.0 or higher

**IMPORTANT PLANNING NOTES**

- Students are responsible for ensuring they meet the prerequisite and/or corequisite requirements.
- Not all courses listed are offered every term, delivery formats vary, and course offerings are subject to change.
- Major &/or Minor declarations can be changed anytime during the declaration period; however, it is recommended that you consult with an advisor to see how this change may affect your studies.
- The same course cannot be used to fulfill more than one requirement for a major(s) and/or minor(s); Additional course work may be required to fulfill the credit requirements of the major(s) and/or minor(s).
- Courses with the notations of W (withdrawal), AU (audit), or TR (transfer) are not included in any GPA calculation.
