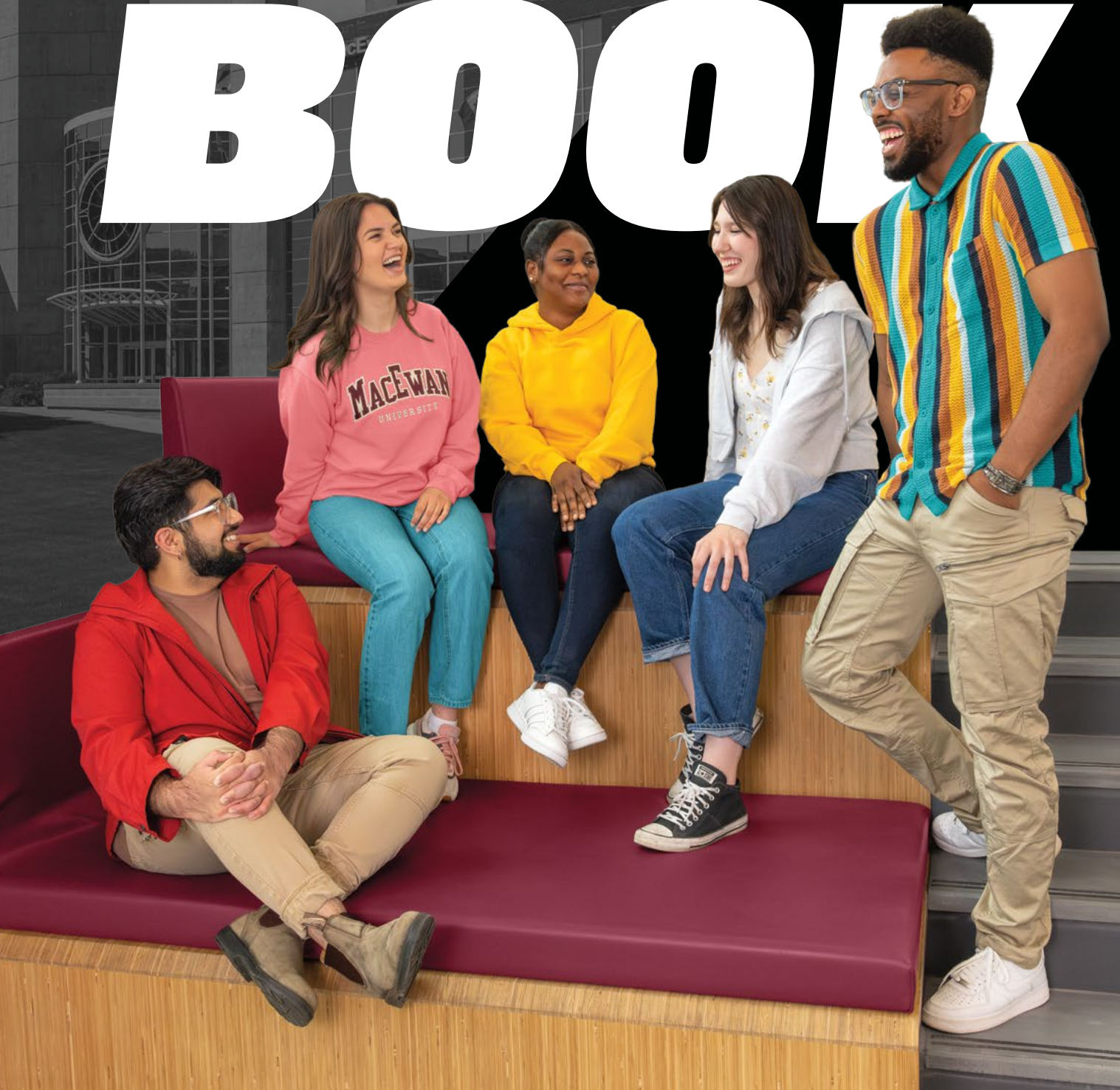

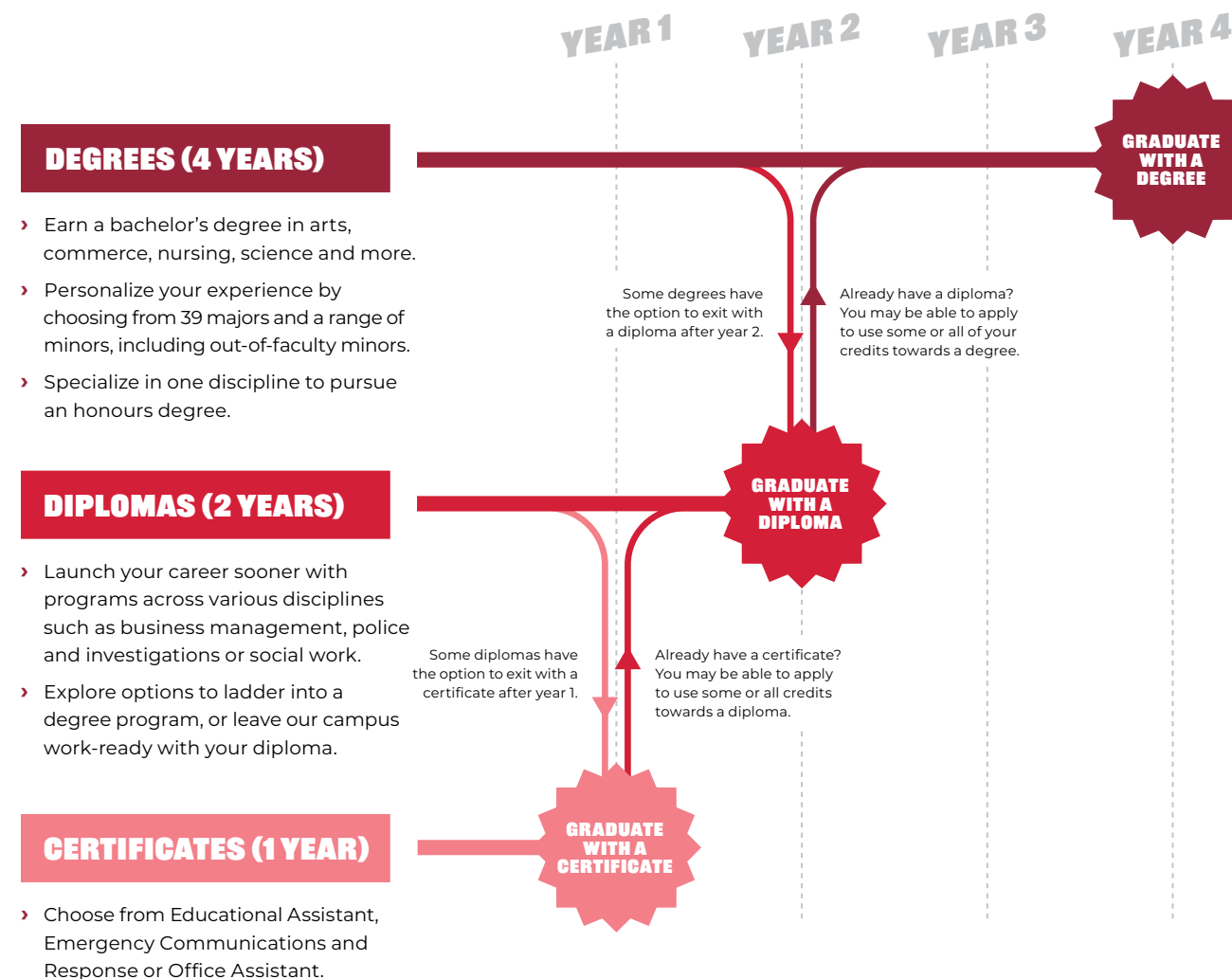

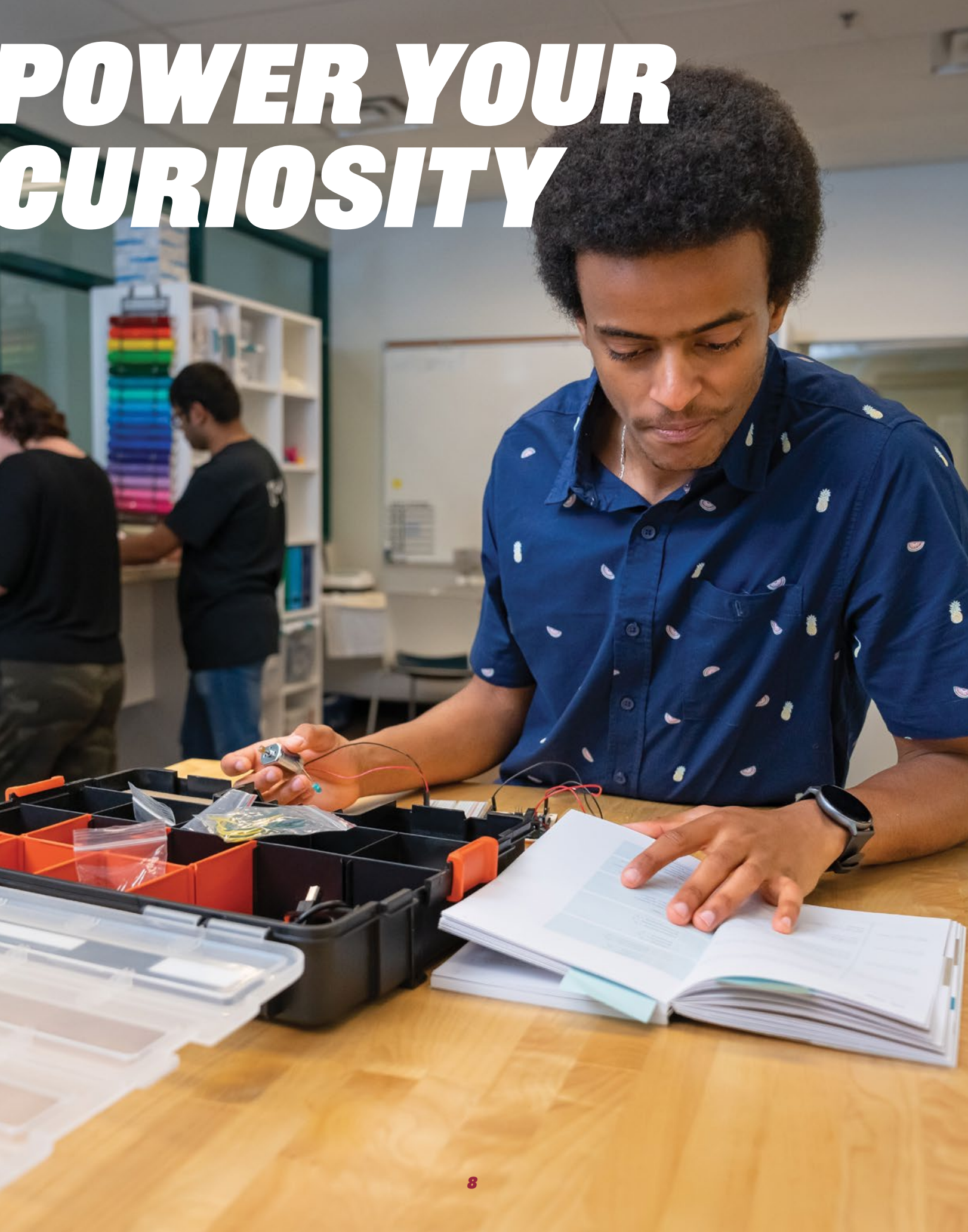

## LEARNING AT MACEWAN

### Conduct groundbreaking research to find the solutions to real problems.

Each year, students are invited to present their research at Student Research Day, where they give an oral or poster presentation detailing their work. From scientific experiments to art creations to community-based scholarship, these students are trendsetters and trend breakers, pursuing new hypotheses and asking new questions. Students can also publish their findings in the *MacEwan University Student eJournal (MUSE)*.

Depending on your program, your research will likely involve much more than spreadsheets or data. Many of our faculties and schools are home to unique facilities dedicated to hands-on learning and research opportunities.

MacEwan's Undergraduate Student Research Initiative (USRI) also provides grants to students looking to pursue their own research in their academic field. We can help you apply for external research awards and research studentships, both provincially and federally.

Several of our faculty have received federal funding to pursue research in their area of expertise. Many of them provide opportunities for students to get involved in their work or with research of their own. Bringing in student researchers allows faculty members to benefit from a wider array of opinions and interpretations in the research process while forging great working relationships.

### GET CREATIVE

Upgrade your hobbies or find a new passion in our Makerspace. Use 3D printers, learn coding, create textiles and borrow tools and tech.

### PRACTICE YOUR SKILLS

Get hands-on experience in our Clinical Simulation Centre. Computerized mannequins and patient actors create real-world scenarios to apply your learning.

### TEST AND OBSERVE

Experiment and gather data in our dedicated zebrafish lab. The fish are common research animals because their brain chemistry is similar to humans.

### ON THE AIR

Learn about production in our professional-quality TV studio. The facility was even used to record an episode of CBS' *48 Hours*.

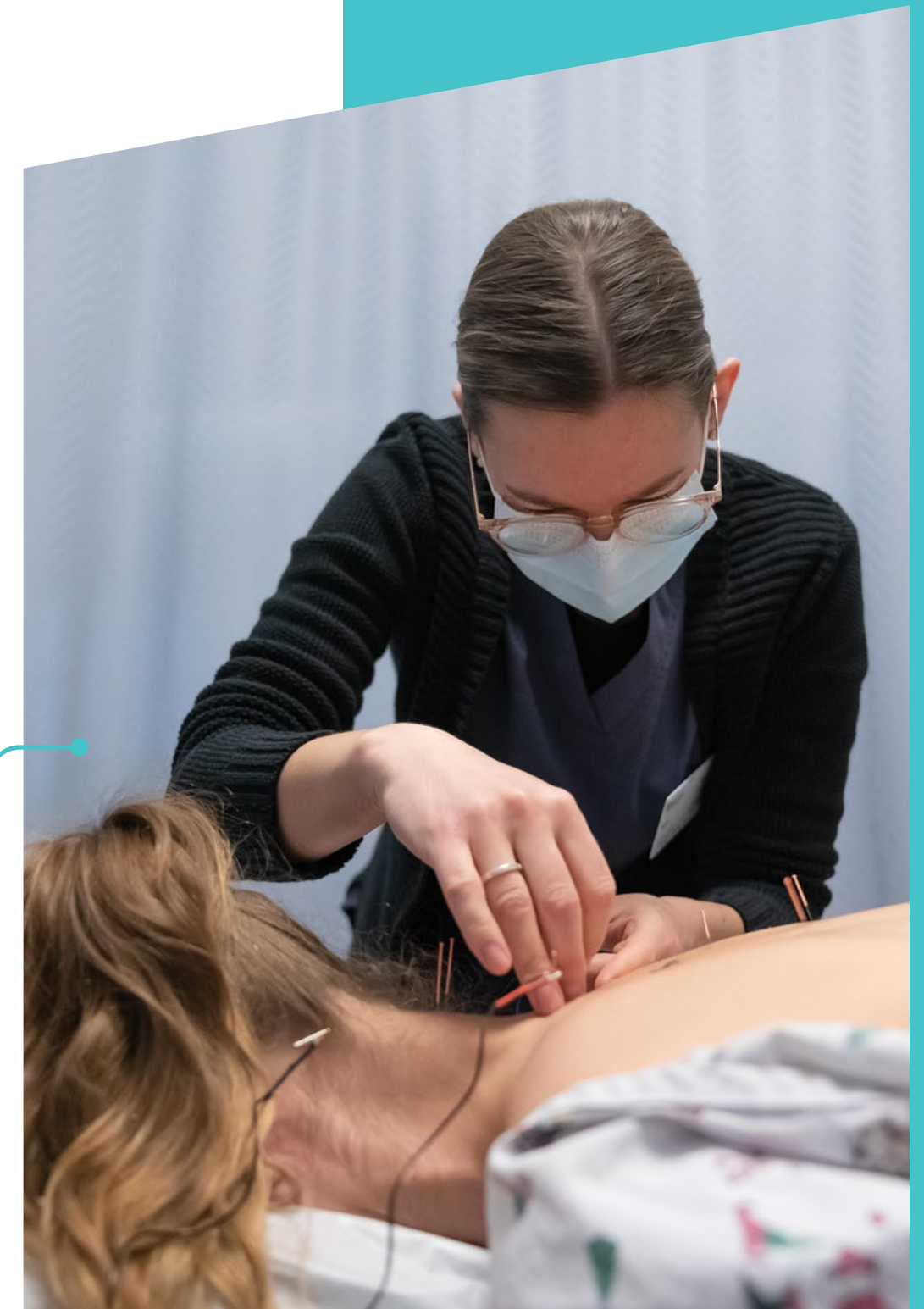

Transfer credit, including previous successfully completed post-secondary coursework, IB courses (5 or higher), AP courses (4 or 5) and dual credit courses articulated with MacEwan University may be considered for transfer credit toward a MacEwan University credential. Transfer credit is assessed after an offer of admission has been made.

Transcripts received from institutions within Canada will automatically be assessed for transfer credit while an assessment of transcripts from institutions outside of Canada must be initiated by the student. After transcripts have been evaluated, a report of transfer credit assessment results is added to the Student Centre in myStudentSystem. It is the student's responsibility to review the transfer credit granted and to understand how it fits with the chosen program of study.
